Dr. Martin is the Senior Vice President of the Center for Heart, Lung and Kidney Disease; and, Medical Director for Global Services. He has been in practice at Children's National Health System since 1986. Dr. Martin was promoted to Professor of Pediatrics, with tenure, at the George Washington University School of Medicine in 1995 and was the Chief of Cardiology from 1997 to 2009. He was named the C. Richard Beyda Professor of Cardiology in 2007.

Dr. Martin was educated at Syracuse University and the State University of New York, Upstate School of Medicine. After a residency at Brown University and the Rhode Island Hospital, he received his training in pediatric cardiology at the Cardiovascular Research Institute at the University of California, San Francisco. He has published over 125 peer reviewed manuscripts, book chapters and invited publications and has presented abstracts at over 120 meetings. Dr. Martin is an invited lecturer who has traveled to over 175 hospitals and universities within the USA as well as around the world. His advocacy efforts in congenital heart disease has advanced CCHD screening nationally and internationally, registries in cardiac catheterization and a new sub board in Adult CHD. He has served in a consultant role within the United States as well as in South America, Asia and the Middle East.

Dr. Martin is board certified in pediatric cardiology, a fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American College of Cardiology, and a member of the Society for Pediatric Research and the American Board of Pediatrics. He has served or is currently serving on the Subboard of Pediatric Cardiology, American Board of Pediatrics; the Chairman of the Section Adult Congenital and Pediatric Cardiology, American College of Cardiology; a member of the American Board of Internal Medicine, Subboard of Adult Congenital Heart Disease; and, the Board of Trustees, American College of Cardiology.

His awards include the Physician Laureate Award from the Larry King Foundation in 2005, Best Doctors in America 1992 to present, Best Pediatric Cardiologists in American 1996 to present, and Congenital Heart Hero Award-Mended Little Hearts 2011.
