Karim Kalache is the Chief of the Maternal-Fetal Medicine Division at Sidra Medical and Research Center. Prior to assuming this role, he served as Vice Chairman of the Department of Obstetrics at the Charité - Universitätsmedizin Berlin, a joint institution of the Freie Universität Berlin and the Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin, one of the oldest and now the largest university hospitals in Europe.

Dr. Kalache was appointed Professor in Obstetrics at the same institution in 2008. Before that he held the position of a Senior Lecturer/Honorary Consultant in Maternal-Fetal Medicine at the Princess Anne Hospital of the University of Southampton, United Kingdom. In the United States, he led the Fetal Imaging Department at the Perinatology Research Branch of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in Detroit Michigan under the guidance of Professor Roberto Romero. Prior to joining the NIH in Detroit in 2001, Dr. Kalache completed his subspecialty training in Maternal-Fetal Medicine fellowship at University College London under the supervision of Professor Charles Rodeck. He completed his residency in obstetrics and gynecology at the Charité University Hospital in Berlin in 1996, where he subsequently served as Associate Professor. Dr. Kalache received his medical degree from the Faculty of Medical Sciences of the University of Algiers, Algeria

Dr. Kalache's clinical and research focus is in prenatal diagnosis and the management of high-risk obstetrical patients. He is on the ISUOG International Faculty list and Level III member of DEGUM since 2002. Dr. Kalache has authored and co-authored over 100 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters on topics related to fetal imaging. He is section-editor for Prenatal Diagnosis and consults for numerous peer-reviewed OB/GYN journals. He is the recipient of the 2001 Drs Haackert Award for outstanding research contribution in Prenatal Medicine and presented the Stuart Campbell lecture on „Ultrasound before operative vaginal delivery“ for authoring the most cited article in the journal of Ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology in 2009. He often lectures at universities, medical institutions, conferences, and various maternal-fetal medicine and ultrasound societies all over the world.
